

PIKE'S PATCHES — BARNs
(Quilt Barn Project beginning early Summer 2005)

The Pike Arts Guild is linking Pike County with Adams and Monroe Counties in Ohio by creating a "Quilt Barn Corridor." We will be painting quilt block "patches" which will be approximately 8' x 8' and installed on barns throughout Pike County. The goal is to hang the quilt blocks on as many as 20 barns spread widely throughout the County starting early summer of 2005 and beginning with barns closest to the center of the County. The big picture goal is for every Appalachian county in Ohio to have these barns and create a trail beginning in Ohio and traveling out through the other Appalachian states.

BARN APPLICATION:

Selected barns should be in good condition, easily visible from a well-maintained road (may be a gravel road), and accessible for installation and for tourist photography. Barn owners will be asked to help pay a small portion of the cost, which is \$100. The selected quilt blocks should, in some way be associated with Pike County (i.e. from quilts made by a resident of Pike County, passed down through a Pike family, designed by a Pike resident). The maker/owner of the quilt (or his or her heirs and assigns) must be willing to sign a waiver licensing use of the quilt design for this project. Without this waiver, quilts may not be selected or only selected under exceptional circumstances. The committee will give preference to blocks which can be replicated, show contrast and therefore be easily visible from a distance. For your quilt to be considered, please fill out the form below and send (1) completed form, and (2) A PHOTOGRAPH OF THE QUILT (showing a block as clearly as possible) to:
